

Surrey Impact Calling Card



Surrey's salmon farming sector is at risk. Left unaltered, Minister Jordan's rushed Discovery Islands decision could wipe out up to 344 Surrey-based jobs, \$220 million in potential lost annual revenue, and \$46 million in potential lost GDP.

Use this calling card to get in touch with key Surrey-based decision makers in the federal and provincial governments. Consider these key messages when you are reaching out:

- 1. This decision is devastating, and ill-considered. It was made without consulting the industry or local communities, and runs contrary to science. It will throw potentially 1,189 people out of work across BC.**
- 2. Salmon farming in BC is important, producing more than 6.5 million meals every week while supporting thousands of local families and small businesses. It is worth supporting, but this decision puts the entire industry at risk.**
- 3. We are asking the Government of Canada to revisit their decision and work with all stakeholders to find a better way forward.**
